This spring, we're celebrating a mom in our community who found stability through our Navigator services. Her story begins when she heard from a neighbor that a Families First Navigator was going around the neighborhood delivering diapers.

When Families First Navigator Josue Quintanilla connected with mom, we realized that she was in need of more services than just diapers. After completing an intake assessment, we learned that mom was taking care of a child with disabilities, unemployed, and had recently received an eviction notice.

We immediately started working to assist mom with rental assistance to help stop the eviction proceedings. Next, we connected her with additional community partners in her area to help meet her family's basic needs like groceries and household goods. Then, we helped her apply for Child Disability and SNAP benefits.

In a short time, mom and her children were doing a lot better! Today, she has moved into a better apartment, has been approved for Child Disability and SNAP benefits, and is receiving continued care from Families First and our community partners.
